CHURCH WARDENS AND THEIR ACCOUNTS

The office of Church Warden is very ancient and goes back to at least the early twelfth century. The Church Wardens were the chief lay officers of the parish and were elected annually in Easter week by the Minister and Parishioners. Canon Law provided that the Wardens, normally two in number, should be elected by joint consent, but if Minister and Parishioners disagreed, then the Minister chose one Warden and the Parishioners another.

Before they could legally act, Church Wardens were required to swear an oath "truly and faithfully to execute the office of Church Warden within the parish, according to the best of their skill and knowledge; and present such things and persons as to their knowledge were presentable, by the Laws Ecclesiastical of the Realm". The Church Wardens then continued in office until new Church Wardens were sworn in.

The responsibilities and tasks to be performed by the Church Wardens were legion and I do not propose to list them all here. To summarise simply however, one can say that the Church Wardens' obligations were to see that parishioners came to Church regularly and that they behaved themselves. Likewise they were obliged to see that the Vicar performed his duties correctly.

The Church Wardens were the most senior members of the Vestry and were ex-officio Overseers of the Poor.

As well as dealing with people, Church Wardens had the responsibility for caring for the structure and fabric of the Church, the furnishings and contents, the bells and the Churchyard. Housekeeping duties such as paying the clerk, purchasing the communion bread and wine, washing the surplice, providing prayer candles and prayer books etc. were also the responsibility of the Church Wardens. Another duty was the payment of bounty to parishioners for catching vermin such as polecats and hedgehogs or sparrows.

All these things cost money, for which the Church Wardens had to account to the Parishioners. To raise the necessary funds the Church Wardens were empowered to make a Church Rate. It was normal to use the same basis of assessment as that used for the Poor Rate, the only difference being that whilst the impropriators of tithes were liable to Poor Rates, they did not pay Church Rates on their tithes. The basic assessments remained constant for around a hundred years, Rates being made as a multiplier of the basic assessment.

The Church Wardens decided amongst themselves which of them would draw up the annual accounts. When produced, these were "audited" by members of the Vestry and the cash in hand passed over to the Church Wardens sworn in for the following year. Sometimes the Church Wardens did not raise sufficient money in Rates to meet the expenditure for the year and the parish ended up in debt to them. In such a case, the next Church Wardens would reimburse the previous ones, out of monies raised from the next Church Rate. Occasionally, when the same Church Wardens continued in office for several years, they might present their accounts for a period covering more than one year.

The earliest surviving Church Wardens' Accounts for High Littleton are for the year 1754/5 and the book containing them goes up to 1786/7. The next book of Church Wardens' Accounts has been lost and no record exists for the period 1787/8 to 1840/1. From then on records have been preserved but only the first year has been included here.

A transcription of the Accounts, in their original spelling, appears on the following pages. Some words look rather strange, but become obvious when pronounced phonetically. Personal names appearing in the Accounts have been indexed at the end.
