## Provisional Chairman

Mr COX, having taken the Chair, informed the Council that the next business would be to select a Chairman for the ensuing year.

It was proposed by Mr Henry CHIVERS and seconded by Mr Tho's EVANS, that Mr WATSON be appointed Chairman for the year ensuing

After some discussion, an amendment was proposed by Col. SCOBELL and seconded by Mr BLANNING, that the Rev'd A.M. FOSTER be appointed Chairman of the Council for the ensuing year.

## Appointment of Chairman

The Chairman having put the amendment, Col. SCOBELL, Mr Tho's BLANNING, Mr Enos FREE and Mr COX voted in favo[u]r of Mr FOSTER, who was declared by the Chairman to be duly **elected**.

Mr COX, (having) vacated the Chair, which was then occupied by the Rev'd A.M. FOSTER, who expressed his thanks to the Council for the appointment.

#### Appointment of Vice Chairman

It was proposed by Mr COX and seconded by Mr BLANNING, that Col. SCOBELL be elected Vice Chairman for the ensuing year. **Carried** unanimously.

## **Appointment of Clerk**

COWEN, the Assistant Overseer, should be appointed the Clerk of the Council.

The question of the Clerk's remuneration was allowed to remain over to the Annual Meeting, in order to ascertain the amount paid to Clerks in parishes of a similar area and Rateable Value to this Parish.

On the motion of Col. SCOBELL, seconded by Mr Tho's EVANS, a Vote of thanks was unanimously **passed** to the Chairman for presiding.

## Drainage from Timsbury Lane

Mr COX proposed and Mr EVANS seconded, "That this drain, which is at present very defective, be put in order forthwith, by opening up and following the present course." **Carried** unanimously.

## Notice of Motion by Mr FREE

Mr FREE gave notice that, at the next Meeting of the Council, he would move the following Resolution - "That the Meetings of this Council shall be held Monthly, on a day and hour to be fixed by the Council."

An Amendment was proposed by Mr EVANS and seconded by Mr COX, that, prior to any steps being taken to repair the Pound, enquiries should be made by the Clerk from Mr GORE LANGTON [Earl Temple]'s Steward, as to the Ownership thereof. The amendment was put to the Council and carried.

Mr WATSON reported that, in case a Telegraph Office were established, the Earl of WARWICK would undertake to pay half the loss which the guarantors might be called upon to meet; and Colonel SCOBELL promised to transfer his telegraph business from Timsbury to High Littleton.

In consequence of the illness of the Clerk [George E. COWEN], who was again unable to be present, the minutes were not yet written into this book but were read in the rough.

Telegraph Office etc.

The Chairman reported that Mr WATSON and himself had had an interview with the Postmaster of Bristol.

A telegraph office could be established, if the sum of £27 were guaranteed. Also a second delivery as far as the post office, and a later despatch of letters, could be arranged, but a Money Order Office could not be promised.

It was also explained that the Parish Council had been under a misapprehension at their last meeting, for the "Post Office Amendment Act 1895" empowers a Parish Council to guarantee the Postmaster general against loss. It was proposed by Mr Enoch YOUNG & seconded by Mr Tho's EVANS, "That the Parish Council do undertake to pay the Postmaster General any loss he may sustain by reason of the establishment of a Postal Telegraph Office at High Littleton." **Carried** unanimously.

It was understood that this resolution was passed on the understanding that the Earl of WARWICK had promised to pay one half of any loss & that others in the Parish were prepared to guarantee a share.

It was proposed by Mr WATSON & seconded by Mr EVANS, "That the Postmaster of Bristol be written to, for the purpose of impressing upon him the importance of establishing a Money Order Office at High Littleton." **Carried** unanimously.

#### Ratcombe Drain

Mr WATSON reported that a sub-committee, consisting of the District Councillors of High Littleton & Farmborough & of Colonel SCOBELL & himself, had been commissioned to meet on the spot & consider what could be done to abate the nuisance in connection with Ratcombe Drain, but a date for such meeting had not yet been agreed upon.

#### Water Supply

The Report of Mr H.H. PURNELL on the Water Supply of the Parish was produced, read & considered.

Dr. BREW, M.O.H.['s] report, which is as follows, was read:

High Littleton: This is a particularly clean mining village, lying well on high ground, with a number of really good working class houses; there are of course some old and ill constructed ones but quite a lot of work has been done in getting these put into decent repair. The village is well supplied with pure water, so there is now no risk of drinking from polluted wells. All that need be done is to reconstruct the Tank at the bottom of Rotcombe, providing for the purification of the overflow in the way already recommended. Most of the houses drain into their own cess-pits or have pail closets. There is plenty of garden ground available and there is no reason why, with proper inspection, these should not be kept in quite a satisfactory state. Population 1,001 not increasing, owing to closing of pit.

Mr G. BRICE (D.C.) explained that when weak spots mentioned had been put in order, the County Council would probably be satisfied.

## **PARISH COUNCILLORS**

The minimum number of Councillors comprising a rural Parish Council was five, as stipulated in the Local Government Act, 1894. High Littleton elected six on 4th December 1894. The first Councillors held office until 15th April 1896, when they retired and newly elected Councillors replaced them. These Councillors then held office for one year until the following 15th April, when they in turn were replaced. The Parish Council consisted of the Elected Councillors and the Chairman (if elected from outside of the Elected Councillors). Thus Rev. Ambrose Millett FOSTER, as Chairman, was also a member of the Council from 1894 until the end of 1900/1.

The Parish Councillors Election Order of 1901 laid down rules for the conduct of election of Councillors, from which time their period of office was extended to three years. No elections were held in 1916 because of the War. High Littleton continued to elect six Councillors until 1946, when the number was increased to nine.

#### **CLERKS**

The first Clerk of the Parish Council, appointed on 13th December 1894, was George Emmanuel COWEN, who was also Assistant Overseer. He remained as such until his death on 26th June 1896.

On 27th July 1896 William Henry MARTIN, headmaster of the village school, was appointed to succeed COWEN as Assistant Overseer and Clerk. He held the latter office until his death on 8th April 1934.

# **CHAIRMEN & VICE-CHAIRMEN OF THE COUNCIL**

The Local Government Act of 1894 obliged the Parish Council to elect a Chairman at the Annual Meeting in April each year and, if thought fit, appoint a Vice-Chairman. The Chairman could be elected from outside the Council, as indeed was Rev. A.M. FOSTER, the first Chairman.

## **OVERSEERS**

The Local Government Act of 1894 obliged the Parish Council to appoint the Overseers at the Annual Meeting in April. This function was previously undertaken by the Vestry. Traditionally High Littleton had two Overseers but the number was increased to four in 1898. The office of Overseer was abolished by the Rating and Valuation Act, 1925.

# **ASSISTANT OVERSEERS**

George Emmanuel COWEN already held the position of Assistant Overseer, when the Parish Council came into being, having been appointed by the Vestry. He continued as Assistant Overseer and Parish Clerk until his death on 26th June 1896.

William Henry MARTIN was appointed to succeed COWEN as Assistant Overseer and Parish Clerk on 27th July 1896. He held the former position until the office of Overseer was abolished.

## **SCHOOL MANAGERS**

The Parish Council appointed a Manager to High Littleton School.

The first such School Manager was Gilbert Beacham LANGLEY, Manager of the High Littleton branch of Radstock Co-operative Stores, who was appointed on 27th May 1903. He resigned on 18th July 1905 and Gilbert Brice CLEAVES was appointed in his stead. CLEAVES was School Manager until 17th April 1934, when he gave up to become Clerk to the Council.

# TRUSTEES OF MARY JONES' CHARITY

Until January 1895, the Trustees of Mary JONES' Charity consisted of the Vicar, the two Churchwardens and the two Overseers. However, as a non ecclesiastical charity, Mary JONES' Charity came under the provisions of Section 14, paragraph 2 of the Local Government Act 1894. This required the Parish Council to appoint Administering Trustees, who held office for four years. The Vicar was an ex officio Trustee. Under Section 14 Para. 7 of the Act, two of the Trustees retired every 2 years and two more were appointed. Retiring Trustees were eligible for re-election. No elections were held during the War and afterwards the normal pattern of electing Trustees was broken.
